Spiritual Approaches to Loss in Aging, Illness and Death

May 5 - 6, 2007

This two-day workshop addresses the spiritual issues of the aging, ill, dying, and bereaved. The combined ancient wisdom from spiritual

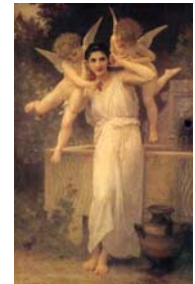

David Lukoff, Ph.D. is a Professor of Psychology at Saybrook Graduate School and co-author of the new DSM-IV diagnostic category "Religious or Spiritual Problem." He has authored over 70 publications on religious and spiritual issues in clinical practice.
